The following is an undated letter with two pictures:

Dear Ruth:

About three years ago we were working at a house in Byron, New York, built in
 the mid 1800s. The current resident and owner related a ghost story concerning
 the house that I thought you might find interesting.

The owner had been living in the house less than a year the first time the
 apparition appeared. The boy friend was sitting in the living room one evening
 reading the newspaper. He felt the presence of someone in the room. He
 glanced up expecting to see a family member. Instead, he was startled to see
 the form of a young girl, possibly in her teens, dressed in blue, standing next to
 his chair. The vision only lasted a second and then was gone.

Some weeks later, again in the evening, the couple were going to bed. The
 women was leading the way going down the hall when she suddenly stepped to
 one side. The young girl in blue had appeared again, standing in the hallway.

The explanation offered is that the house was the early residence of a doctor.
 In those days there were no hospitals so it was common practice for doctors to
 occasionally keep more seriously ill patients in their homes to give them treatment.
 It is possible that the young girl was such a patient who died in the house.

After our work there was finished, I went back to the house for some final
 adjustment. The house was empty. I completed my work and then called to the
