AGRICULTURAL AND FARMLAND PROTECTION BOARD Established Resolution No. 19 – 1993

This Board shall advise the County Legislature and work with the County Planning Board in relation to the proposed establishment, modification and termination of any agricultural district. The Board shall render expert advice relating to the desirability of such action, including advice as to the nature of farming and farm resources within any proposed or established area and the relation of farming in such area to the County as a whole. The Board revises and makes recommendations on revisions to the classification of specific land areas based on local soil, land and climatic conditions to the Department of Agriculture and Markets. The Board also reviews Notice of Intent Filings to undertake an action within an agricultural district involving the advancement of Public Funds for certain construction projects.

Membership: This Board shall consist of four active farmers residing within the County, one representative of agribusiness, one representative of an organization dedicated to farmland preservation, a County Cooperative Extension Agent, County Director of Planning, County Director of Real Property Tax Services, Chair of the County Soil and Water Conservation District’s Board of Directors, and a member of the County Legislature.

GENESEE COMMUNITY COLLEGE BOARD OF TRUSTEES

The Genesee Community College Board of Trustees is the policy making body of the College. In order to discharge their legal responsibilities, members of the Board serve on the three-standing committees, (Buildings & Grounds, Personnel, and Policy), and on ad hoc and special committees of the whole from time to time. The Board is responsible for a wide range of College business from the approval of new curricula and the decision to modify facilities to the appointment of the President. The Board reviews and approves the college budget each year and recommends its adoption to the Genesee County Legislature. The Board also approves collective bargaining contracts when they are negotiated, and recommends their approval to the Legislature. They participate in the celebration and ceremonies of the College especially by taking part in conferring of degrees at graduation.

Membership: Nine members are appointed for **seven** year terms. Four are appointed by the New York State Governor and five are appointed by the County Legislature. In addition, the students elect a tenth Board member for a one-year term on an annual basis.

Meetings: Official business is transacted at regularly scheduled monthly meetings on the second Monday evening of each month in the College Board Room at GCC.

MENTAL HEALTH/COMMUNITY SERVICE BOARD
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The New York State Mental Hygiene Law states that Local Governments, in order to receive state aid, must establish a local Mental Health Unit with a Board of Directors with Sub-Committees to deal with the three major disability areas. Mental Illness, Mental Retardation, Developmental Disabilities and Alcohol Substance Abuse. This is a policy making Board. It revises services, determines need and develops programs of prevention, treatment, social and vocational rehabilitation, consultation, and public education on mental disabilities.

Membership: 15 members appointed by the Legislature. Whenever practicable at least one member shall be a licensed physician and one member shall be a certified psychologist and otherwise at least two members shall be licensed physicians. The other members shall represent the community interest in all the problems of the mentally disabled.

Meetings: Monthly meetings are held at least 10 times per year on the fourth Thursday at 4:00 PM at the Mental Health Clinic. A \$40.00 stipend is paid per meeting.

NOTE: The Genesee County Legislature passed a local law on January 26, 2005, Local Law No Three of 2005 which states “Notwithstanding the provisions of subdivision (d) of section 41.11 of the Mental Hygiene Law, the members of the Community Services Board of the County of Genesee or of any subcommittee thereof, may serve more than two consecutive terms of office effective immediately.

SOIL & WATER CONSERVATION DISTRICT DIRECTORS

There is no salary, but an honorarium is paid along with any accrued mileage and other approved expenses. This is a policy making Board.

Meetings: One meeting per month held at Soil & Water Conservation District Office in Batavia and up to six special meetings per year.

TRAFFIC SAFETY BOARD

Established by Local Law No. 3 1975, Resolution No. 191

Reorganized by Resolution No. 104-88

This Board's function and purpose is to promote and encourage street and highway traffic safety; to formulate county-wide highway safety programs and coordinate efforts of interested parties and agencies engaged in traffic safety education; to cooperate with local officials within the county in the formulation and execution of traffic safety programs and activities; to study traffic conditions on streets and highways within the county, study and analyze reports of accidents and causes thereof; and to coordinate and direct all local activities related to the implementation of the state highway safety program as approved by the Governor or his designee.

Membership: The Board shall consist of not less than ten members interested in traffic safety and traffic problems and shall be appointed by the Genesee County Legislature. Each member shall be a resident of Genesee County and shall be a qualified elector thereof. At least one but not more than three of such members shall be a resident of the City of Batavia and the balance of such members shall be appointed from the county at large. This is a volunteer Board with a term of office of three years.

Meetings: Shall be held within the County at least twice a year but limited to no more than 4 per year when the Board shall deem it advisable. Interested parties and agencies, public and private, interested in traffic regulation, control, safety, and education are invited to participate. Meetings are usually held at the County Sheriff's Office in the Conference Room.

<p>WATER RESOURCES AGENCY Established Resolution No. 495-98</p>

Created to assist the Legislature in the planning and implementation of future water improvements for the County of Genesee. To consist of nine members, each appointed for three year terms and each to be a resident of Genesee County. No more than three County Legislators may be members of the Agency at any time.

This agency shall have the following powers & duties:

1. To assemble data relating to the water resources available to the County, both within and without its boundaries.
2. To assist in the planning and design of coordinated water resource and transmission projects within the County of Genesee and make recommendations in connection with such projects.
3. To recommend and assist in the development of intermunicipal agreements and grant applications for water supply and transmission pursuant to Article 5-G of the General Municipal Law.
4. To contract for engineering and related technical services within the annual budgetary appropriations provided to the Agency by the County and if requested, to provide said services to municipalities within the County pursuant to contract with said municipalities.
5. To contract for other necessary services to carry out its functions within the annual budgetary appropriation provided to the Agency by the County subject to the provisions of Article 5-A of the General Municipal Law and audit requirements of the County Legislature.
6. To serve as administrative head or body of any county water district that may hereinafter be created.
7. To coordinate the implementation of any county water resource or transmission project or district with comprehensive planning and land use regulation and consistent with any intermunicipal agreements entered into by other municipalities in Genesee County pursuant to Article 5-J of the General Municipal Law.
8. To have such other powers and duties as may from time to time be lawfully conferred upon the Agency by the County Legislature. It is expressly provided, however, that nothing contained herein shall be construed as modifying, transferring or abolishing any power, duty or authority of the County Legislature, any county department or elected or appointed official.

The Agency shall prepare an annual report of its activities in the form required by the County Legislature not later than October 1st of each year.

YOUTH BOARD

Develops effective recommendations and programs for the prevention and control of delinquency, crimes by youths, and to further youth development. Acts as liaison between executive, administrative and other legislative bodies in respect to the solutions of youth problems and for the enactment of youth programs. Encourages closer cooperation between employers, labor, churches, recreation commissioners, state and local employment programs, service clubs and other public and private agencies so as to stimulate employment for youth and encourage sound youth programs on the basis of community planning. Review and analyze grants, accept or reject the creation of expansion of recreation and youth services projects, and review and analyze statistical records and data that reflect the incidence and trends of delinquency and youthful crimes and offenses.

Membership: The Youth Bureau shall have a membership of 20, one from each of the following municipalities: Elba; Darien/Corfu/Pembroke; Oakfield/Alabama; Byron/Bergen; Pavilion/Bethany; LeRoy; Alexander; Stafford and the Town of Batavia; two from the City of Batavia; the remainder representing the following: County Probation Department, Social Services Department, Job Development Bureau, and four youth representatives. All representatives will be appointed for a term of four years, unless they represent a County Department, then it is their tenure of office. Meetings are held the third Monday of the month.
