Dear Legislators:

On behalf of the dedicated men and women of the Genesee County Sheriff's Office, I proudly submit to you the Genesee County Sheriff's Office 2011 Annual Report.

During 2011, members of the Genesee County Sheriff's Office worked daily in support of our mission to enhance the quality of life for Genesee County residents. Towards that goal, staff of the Sheriff's Office worked closely with other criminal justice and support agencies within the county to enhance public safety and corrections. We took a zero tolerance position with regard to underage drinking and unlawful possession of alcohol, and deputies charged 174 persons with DWI. It was a busy year with deputies responding to 21,540 calls for service, excluding traffic stops, which reflects an approximate 26% increase over 2010.

The Jail Bureau saw a significant increase in the average daily male population at seventy-one (71) compared to sixty-eight (68) in 2010, and the average daily female population remained constant at nine (9) as compared to ten (10) during 2010.

The Emergency Dispatch Center logged in a total of 54,134 consolidated calls for service, of which 30,335 were 9-1-1 calls. This reflects an approximate 3% increase over 2010.

I would like to express my sincere appreciation to the Genesee County Legislature and County Administration for their continued support of the Office of Sheriff and public safety in Genesee County.

### *Law Enforcement Code of Ethics*

**T**he Genesee County Sheriff's Office is a New York State accredited public safety organization with responsibilities which includes the enforcement of all laws, maintaining peace and order, preserving the rights of our citizens, protecting property and personal safety; providing professional public safety dispatching services; providing animal control services; and assisting persons in need. Further, responsibilities include providing a safe and secure Jail, meeting the needs of victims and providing community service programs, and properly receiving and executing any and all legal civil processes referred to the Office of the Sheriff.

**As a Law Enforcement Officer**, my fundamental duty is to serve mankind; to safeguard lives and property; to protect the innocent against deception, the weak against oppression or intimidation, and the peaceful against violence or disorder; and to respect the Constitutional rights of all men to liberty, equality and justice.

**I will** keep my private life unsullied as an example to all; maintain courageous calm in the face of danger, scorn or ridicule; develop self-restraint; and be constantly mindful of the welfare of others. Honest in thought and deed in both my personal and official life. I will be exemplary in obeying the laws of the land and the regulations of my department. Whatever I see or hear of a confidential nature or that is confided to me in my official capacity will be kept ever secret unless revelation is necessary in the performance of my duty.

**I will** never act officiously or permit personal feelings, prejudices, animosities or friendships to influence my decisions. With no compromise for crime and with relentless prosecution of criminals, I will enforce the law courteously and appropriately without fear or favor, malice or ill will, never employing unnecessary force or violence and never accepting gratuities.

**I recognize** the badge of my office as a symbol of public faith, and I accept it as a public trust to be held so long as I am true to the ethics of the police service. I will constantly strive to achieve these objectives and ideals, dedicating myself to my chosen profession . . . law enforcement.

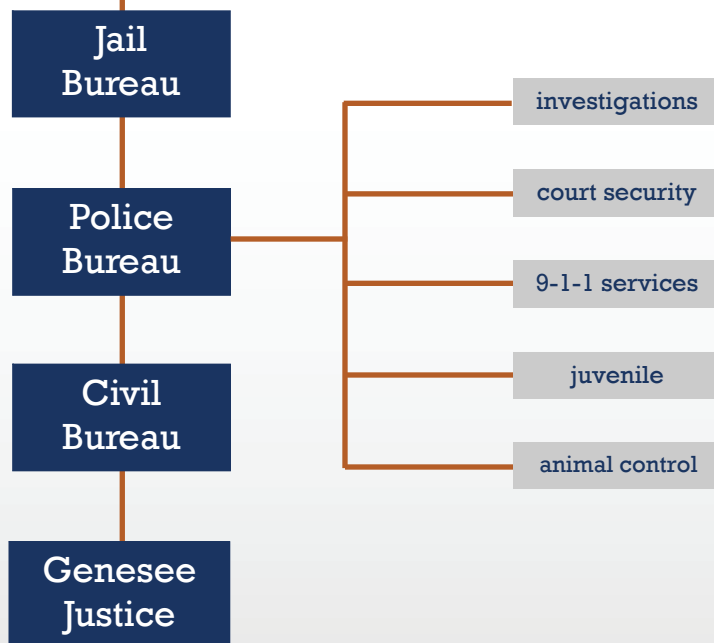

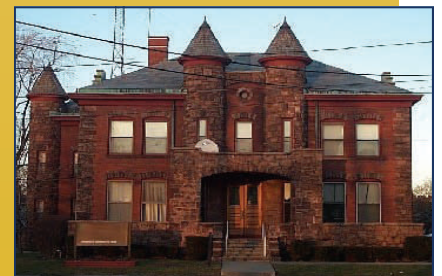

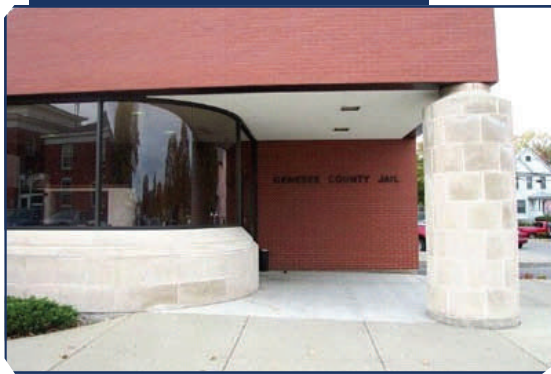

**The Jail Bureau** of the Sheriff's Office has the responsibility of meeting the Department's Mission concerning the corrections function.

County Law, Article 17, Section 650 acknowledges the Sheriff as an Officer of the Court; Correction Law, Article 20, Section 500C designates the Sheriff as custodian of the County Jail. The Correction Law further states that the Sheriff shall receive and safely keep all persons lawfully committed to his custody for safekeeping, examination or trial, or as a witness, committed or sentenced to imprisonment, or committed for contempt.

### The functions of the Jail Bureau include:

- proper care, custody, treatment, supervision, discipline and correctional programs for all persons committed to the custody of the Sheriff
- assure compliance with the laws, codes, rules and regulations for the operation and management of the County Jail
- create conditions and opportunities for inmates to increase their abilities to function in society as productive, law-abiding citizens.

The benefactors of the activities of the Jail Bureau are the inmates themselves, as well as the general public.

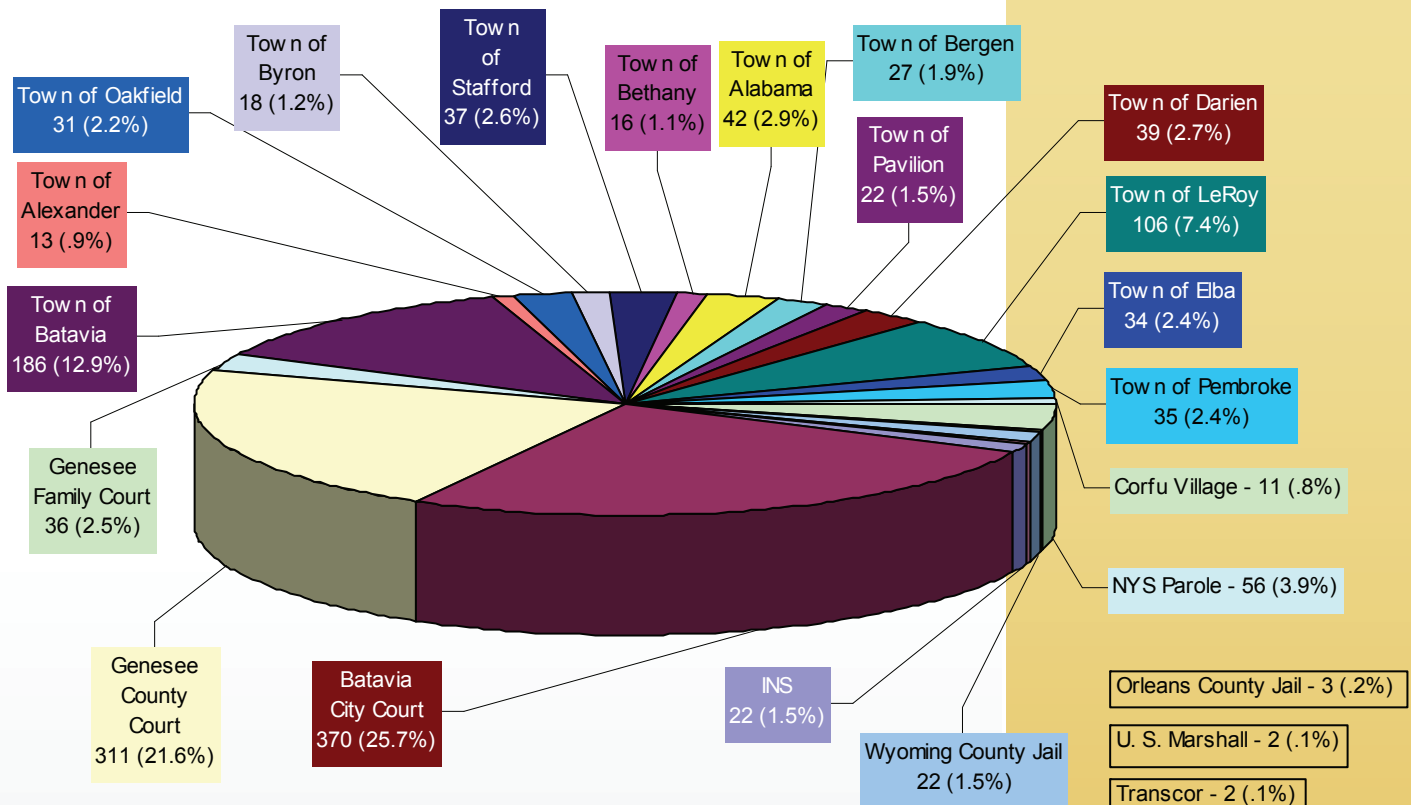

# Civil Bureau

**The Civil Bureau** of the Sheriff's Office has the responsibility of handling any and all legal processes in the county that are referred to the Office of the Sheriff.

## The functions of the Civil Bureau include:

- the proper receiving and execution of all legal processes, including attachments, evictions, judgments, seizure orders, civil arrests and other summons
- the maintenance of accurate records of all civil processes and transactions

County Law, Article 17, Section 650 acknowledges the Sheriff as an Officer of the Court. The Civil Practice Laws and Rules of the State of New York (CPLR) govern the procedures in civil judicial proceedings in all courts of the state and before all judges. The CPLR sets forth the duties of the Sheriff in his role as an Officer of the Court.

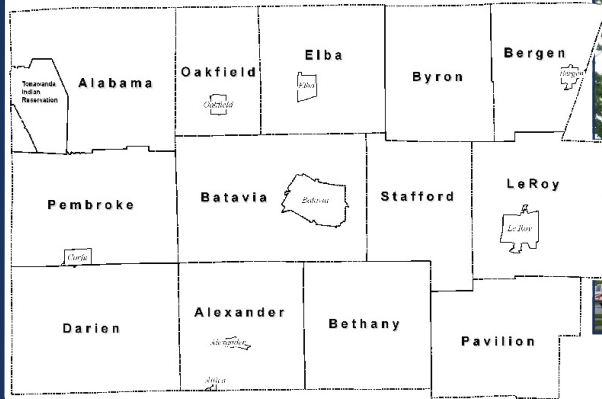

**The Criminal Investigation Division** of the Sheriff's Office serves to support and augment the Road Patrol Division in meeting the Department's Mission.

Vice and related cases consist of murder, burglary, larceny, robbery, possession of weapon, assault, escape, parole checks, warrant arrests, camera installs, computer crimes, drug identification, underage drinking, vehicle and traffic arrests, and possession of stolen property.

Criminal investigation requires specialized training, skills, and techniques that are not normally available to the Road Patrol Division. In addition, criminal investigations often require long hours of painstaking work that patrol officers cannot afford to take from their regular patrol duties.

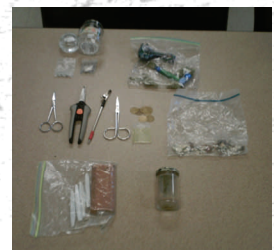

The Communications Section also answers all telephone communications which come into the Sheriff's Office, Batavia Police, and LeRoy Police and redirects these communications accordingly.

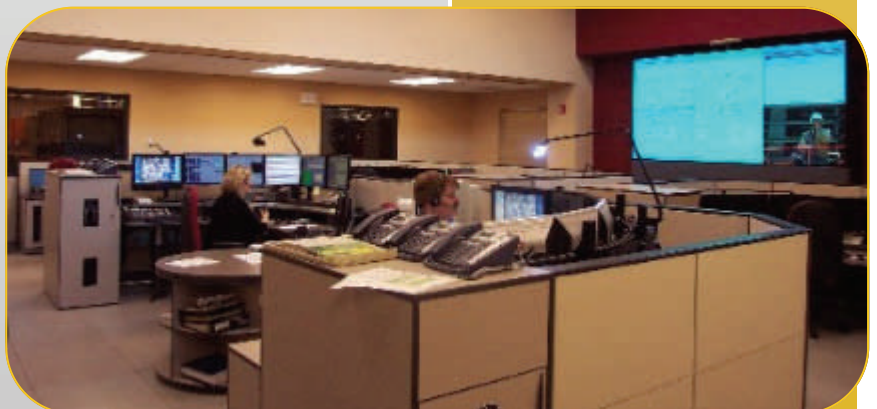

# ANIMAL CONTROL

**The Animal Control** section of the Sheriff's Office has the responsibility of operating the Genesee County Animal Shelter and enforcing laws pertaining to the treatment of animals.

The Sheriff has been designated by the Genesee County Legislature to administer, supervise and operate the Genesee County Animal Shelter, as well as, enforce any and all laws pertaining to domestic animals.

Genesee Community College and the Genesee County Sheriff's Office partnered together to offer students enrolled in the Veterinary Technology program an opportunity to assist the Volunteers at the Shelter. Students are responsible for cleaning cages, feeding animals, and working in the kennels. Not only are the students able to utilize their skills in administering medication and performing test diagnostics, all under the supervision of licensed veterinarians, but they're also simultaneously providing a community service.

## **The functions of the Animal Control Section include:**

- ensuring any and all animals impounded are properly sheltered, fed and watered, properly adopted, redeemed, or disposed of in a humane manner
- investigating and enforcing the New York State Agriculture and Markets Laws, Public Health Laws, or any other laws pertaining to animals
- properly maintaining any and all records pertaining to the operation of the Animal Shelter and the control of animals

#### Community Service...

is a sentencing option that is an alternative to incarceration. It provides a cost-effective way of dealing with non-violent, low-risk offenders, which reduces jail costs, while providing needed services to community non-profit organizations. A total of 315 community service cases were received in 2011.

#### Judicial Diversion...

is a screening process that allows our legal system to place selected offenders with an alternate disposition. This initiative allows offenders to earn sentencing opportunities, which holds them accountable for their actions with the court while ensuring that the victims of the offense maintain involvement with the eventual outcome.

#### Bail Evaluation/RUS Program...

is a screening and supervision program for those defendants who may not be able to post bail or the court desires to release under supervision status. The population covered includes jail pre-trial detainees and those appearing directly before the court. The focus of the program is to have the defendant reappear for his/her next court appearance, remain law-abiding in the community and participate in treatment when so directed by the court. A total of 433 bail evaluations were conducted in 2011.

#### DWI/CD Program...

is designed to provide a meaningful intervention for selected DWI charged offenders. Requirements of the program focus on a certified alcohol evaluation, treatment follow up, random alcohol testing, etc. The supervision period is for 12 months. If successful, defendants have their DWI charges reduced to DWAI or for very high BAC levels, a "no jail, no probation" outcome. 190 new participants were received in 2011, making the total participants for this program 291.

## COMPREHENSIVE VICTIM SERVICES

Comprehensive Victim Services Corrections has the mission of providing direct services and victim advocacy for victims of crime. Through an ongoing supportive relationship with a Victim Assistant, the client is assisted in acquiring knowledge and services available to them through the Crime Victim's Board and the Criminal Justice System. Clients are also made aware of

information related to the investigation, apprehension, prosecution and disposition of the person(s) who committed a crime against them, as well as accompanying them to court proceedings if they so desire. Victim clients are also provided with the opportunity to address the harm done to them in other non-traditional methods that involve the use of restorative justice principles.

## JUSTICE FOR CHILDREN ADVOCACY CENTER (JFCAC)

...focuses on providing assistance to child-victims of physical and sexual abuse cases by reducing trauma and enhancing the prosecution of such cases. This initiative incorporates 20 agencies working together to help child-victims cope with the trauma of such an experience and to

prepare them to handle the pressure of courtroom testimony. Medical exams and/or joint forensic interviews for sexually or physically abused children are conducted at the Justice for Children Advocacy Center, a child-friendly house located in a downtown neighborhood.

Our Superintendent has told us that there was no way the grounds could have been kept in a presentable condition this year without the inmates' contribution.





As you know the first few minutes of an emergency call like this is a very confusing and fast moving situation. The dispatch staff that was working did an excellent job of fulfilling every request I made. In fact, the proactive approach that your people took to ensure that a Mercy Flight Helicopter was dispatched may have made difference for one of the victims.

The radio traffic from this call alone could tax the capabilities of the dispatch center. All of the units from multiple agencies using the radio at the same time can be difficult to handle.

I would like to thank the dispatchers that were on duty handling this call. Not only were my radio requests made in a quick and efficient manor, the phone calls that I made were handled very well. As it is on location as well as the dispatch center, a call like this cannot be successful without team work. The staff that was on duty during this call demonstrated the type of team work and dedication that is necessary to be successful in the emergency response business.

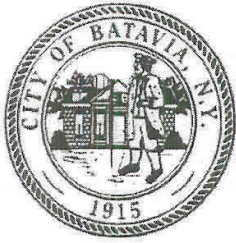

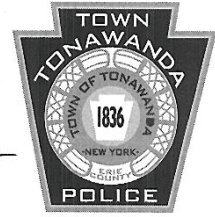
