WHEREAS, The County desires to conduct that impact study as an independent review of P25 800 MHz / VHF High Band Paging System Upgrade, and

WHEREAS, After careful review by the Sheriff, Emergency Management Coordinator, County Attorney, and Director of Emergency Communications, it is recommended the contract for this project not to exceed \$43,967.76, and

WHEREAS, The Committees on Ways and Means did review this proposal and does recommend approval at this time. Now, therefore, Be it

RESOLVED, That the Genesee County Chair and the Sheriff are authorized to enter into an agreement with Pericle Communications Company, 7222 Commerce Center Drive, Suite 180, Colorado Springs, CO 80919, for the 800 MHz impact study for a cost not to exceed \$43,967.76.

WHEREAS, The Deputy County Treasurer position was budgeted to return to \$71,156 upon the resignation of the position of Director of Real Property Tax Services I and the position of Director of Real Property Tax Services I was to be set at an annual salary of \$59,000 upon the appointment of the next Director, Now, therefore, Be it

RESOLVED, That the Genesee County Treasurer is hereby authorized and directed to amend the 2013 Management Salary Schedule to reflect a base salary for the Deputy County Treasurer at \$71,156, and a base salary for the Director of Real Property Tax Services I at \$59,000 per year.

Budget Impact Statement: The promotion of the Deputy Director was budgeted for in the 2013 budget. A decrease in salary for Director from \$67,202 to \$59,000 and the elimination of the \$5,000 stipend to the Deputy County Treasurer. A reduction in FICA was also budgeted.
