

Present: Legislators Clattenburg, Bausch, DeJaneiro, Torrey. Also Present: Legislators Cianfrini, Stein and Davis; County Manager Jay Gsell, County Attorney Zambito, Sheriff Maha, Highway Superintendent Tim Hens, Jail Superintendent Zepfel, Chief Deputy Patrol Dibble, Director of Emergency Communications Sharpe, Genesee Justice Program Coordinator Ford, Park Supervisor Osborn, and JFCAC Supervisor Bezon. Reporters Paul Mrozek from The Batavia Daily News and Howard Owens from the Batavian were in attendance.

Chair Clattenburg called the meeting to order at 4:30 PM in the Legislature Conference Room. The minutes of the March 17, 2015 meeting were approved upon motion of Legislator DeJaneiro seconded by Legislator Bausch.

Sheriff Gary Maha provided the Committee with a detailed department review. In regards to the Police Bureau, Deputies have responded to 7,197 incidents during the first quarter of 2015. Deputies have made 470 male and female transports outside of Genesee County. Fifty-eight cases have been assigned to CID this year. Most of the cases were committed by persons outside of the County. Events of the Emergency Dispatch Center were noted. The radio project is continuing with major changes to communication policy and procedure due to the newer technologies. The average female jail population during the first quarter was 11. The male average daily population was 60. Activity within the Civil Bureaus involving income executions and civil processes has decreased slightly in comparison to 2014. A review of the RUS caseload was provided. A breakdown of programs provided to the Public was provided. Staffing positions were also discussed.

Sheriff Maha requested approval to participate in the New York State Division of Homeland Security & Emergency services Mutualink Program for the purpose of providing interoperable communications. This was approved for placement on the next Legislature Agenda by a motion was made by Legislator Bausch which was seconded by Legislator Torrey. A voice vote was taken and the motion was approved. **(Resolution #1)**

A request was made by Highway Superintendent Tim Hens for the Oakfield-Alabama Lions Club to hold a Fishing Derby on June 27, 2015 at DeWitt Park. A motion was made by Legislator DeJaneiro seconded by Legislator Torrey. A voice vote was taken and the motion was approved. **(Resolution #2)**

Next approval for the Association for Conservation of Recreational and Natural Spaces(ACORNS) to hold a trail run and walk fundraiser on October 11, 2015 was requested by Superintendent Hens. This was approved for placement on the next Legislature Agenda by a motion made by Legislator Torrey seconded by Legislator Bausch. A voice vote was taken. The motion was approved. **(Resolution #3)**

Superintendent Hens requested approval for a Deer Management Hunting Program for Genesee County Park. This was referred to Ways & Means with a recommendation for placement on the next Legislature Agenda upon motion of Legislator Bausch and seconded by Legislator Torrey. A voice vote approved the motion. **(Resolution # 4)**

An amendment to Local Law No. 7 – 2002 of Genesee County Department of Parks, Recreation and Forestry Rules and Regulations to include the Deer Management Hunting Rules and Regulations as an appendix. This was referred to Ways and Means with a recommendation for placement on the next Legislature Agenda upon motion of Legislator Bausch and seconded by Legislator Torrey. A voice vote approved the motion. **(Resolution #5)**

Highway Superintendent Hens requested agreement renewal for highway work clothing. The agreement noted is with Coyne Textile Services of Buffalo, NY per bid specifications effective June 1, 2015 through May 31, 2016. A motion was made by Legislator DeJaneiro and seconded by Legislator Bausch. A voice vote approved the motion. **(Resolution #6)**

Highway Superintendent Hens advised the Committee of a recent bid for a Bulldozer. A request to initiate a 5 year lease to own a new D5K2 Bulldozer from Milton Caterpillar in the amount of \$154,355 was made. This was approved for placement on the next Legislature Agenda upon motion of Legislator DeJaneiro and Legislator Bausch. A voice vote approved the motion. **(Resolution #7)**

Lastly, Superintendent Hens requested a salary schedule amendment for a Senior Building Maintenance Mechanic for a period of 6 months effective April 27, 2015. This was referred to Ways and Means with a recommendation for placement on the next Legislature Agenda upon motion of Legislator DeJaneiro and a second by Legislator Bausch. A voice vote approved the motion. **(Resolution #8)**

Chairperson Clattenburg presented the next resolution for approval that being the Memorialization – in support of Senate Bill S3600. This bill supports enforces Alcohol Beverage Control Law Section 65-c (Underage Possession of an Alcoholic Beverage) and Penal Law Section 221.05 (Unlawful Possession of Marijuana. This was approved for placement on the next Legislature Agenda upon motion of Legislator Bausch and seconded by Legislator Torrey. A voice vote was passed this motion unanimously. **(Resolution #9)**

County Manager Jay Gsell has no additional comments.

The next Public Service meeting will be held on Monday, May 18 2015 at 4:30PM in the Old Courthouse Conference Room.

A motion was made by Legislator Bausch and seconded by Legislator DeJaneiro to adjourn at 5:51 PM.
